Discussion Questions:

Old Testament

1. In 1 Samuel 31:1-7, Saul and his armor-bearer were overtaken by their enemies in battle, and each fell on his own sword to kill himself. Did the armor-bearer act correctly when he refused Saul's order to kill him. Are these death's properly called "suicide?" How do they compare to the death of Samson in Judges 16:30?
2. God himself called David "a man after his own heart." 1 Samuel 13:14. How do we reconcile God's proclamation with the terrible sins committed by David?

New Testament

1. What was the significance of the chief priests' desire to kill Lazarus, who had been raised from the dead? John 12:9-11.
2. Why was it that most of the people did not believe in Jesus, even though he had performed so many miracles right before them? John 12:37-43.
