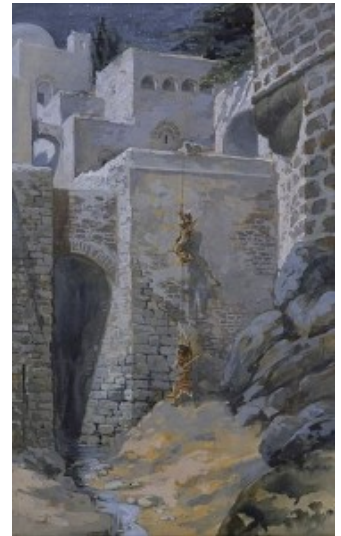


Week 15, One Year Bible Challenge: “Things Are Not Always What They Seem”

Old Testament
