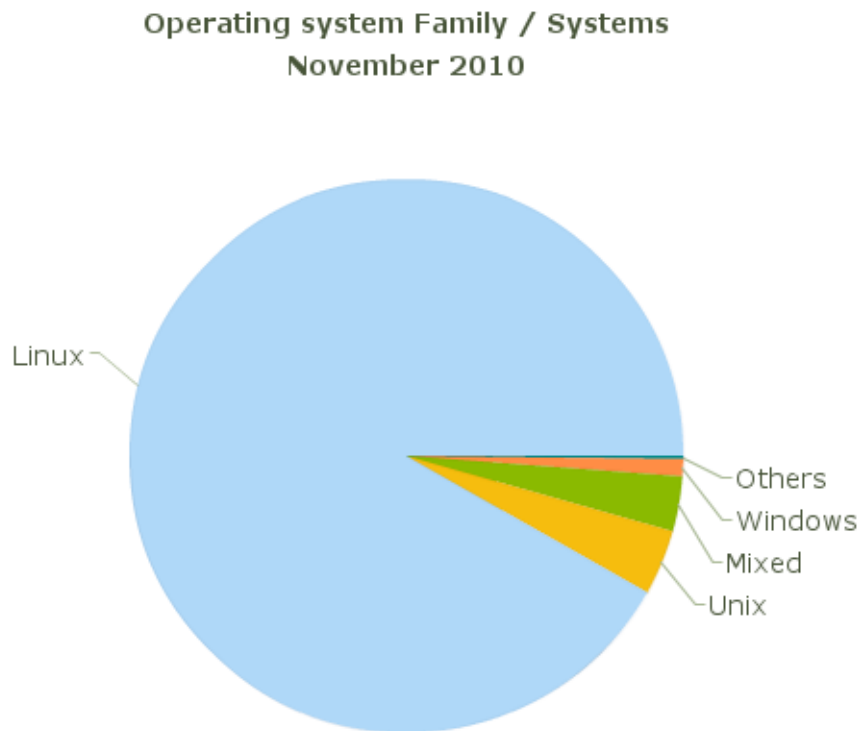


Chart showing the market share of the top 500 supercomputers
